DESCRIPTION OF NESSESARY FIRST-AID MEASURES:

INHALATION: If affected, remove to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing,

SPECIFIC HAZARDS ARISING FROM THE CHEMICAL:

UNUSUAL FIRE & EXPLOSION HAZARDS: COMBUSTIBLE LIQUID. Vapors are heavier than air. Vapors may settle in low or confined areas, or travel long distances along the ground or surface to an ignition source where they may ignite, flashback, or explode. Keep away from heat, sparks, flames or other sources of ignition (e.g., static electricity, pilot lights, mechanical/electrical equipment). Contact with strong oxidizing agents may cause fire. Rags soaked in solvent can present a fire hazard and should be stored in UL listed or Factory Mutual approved, covered containers. SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Soak up residue with non-flammable absorbent material. Do not use sawdust or other cellulose-type material. Place in non-leaking containers for immediate disposal.
